3. GEOPARK ACTIVITIES

Major achievements in 2022

We successfully finished with implementation of the "Geo-stories of UNESCO Geopark"
project. The biggest investment was the construction of a new visitor centre in Voćin - Geo

- Info Centre. The Centre is the starting point for getting to know the Papuk UGGp through a multimedia and interactive exhibition.
- Geopark square in Velika is redecorated, and eight new interpretative panels were installed dedicated to topics of Sustainable Development Goals and geodiversity of the Papuk UGGp.

Geoconservation

- Conservation measures are carried out regularly on geologically important sites
- By the source of the Jankovački stream, there are tufa rocks. Frequent visitor traffic has caused damage to the fragile habitat. To protect the tufa, a wooden fence was erected.

Sustainable tourism (Geotourism)

- purchasing of 30 mountain and electric bikes which could be rented in three different places New education programmes on geoconservation, sustainable development and disaster risk reduction
 - Rupko's geological school translation of working materials into English language
 - At the "Geopark Square" new panels was set up (SDGs + geodiversity)
